

# Section 12182(b)(1)(A)(i) Denial of participation

"It shall be discriminatory to subject an individual...on the basis of a disability..., directly, or through contractual, licensing, or other arrangements, to a denial of the opportunity of the individual or class to participate in or benefit from the goods, services, facilities...



#### Thurston v. Midvale

"...appellant offers no legal support for its theory that it cannot be liable for ADA discrimination if it hires someone else to do the discrimination."

# Generally

If a third party product or service is integrated into your offering, that third party integration constitutes part of your overall offering and you are potentially responsible for any shortcomings, just as you would be your own.



# Generally

If a third party product or service is incidental to your offering, then you are far less likely to be responsible for its accessibility.



#### General Test

Does my offering rely upon a third party integration for functionality or access to content?



# Objective

To improve product and service procurement processes and strengthen accessibility when reliant upon third-party sourced products and services in your digital offerings.



# Third-Party Integrations

- Services
  - Freelance writers
  - SEO agencies
  - Video production studio
- Products
  - Feed embeds (social, financial, news, etc. feeds)
  - Frameworks (website, web apps, mobile apps, etc.)
  - Software, platforms, etc.



# **Procurement Policy Creation**

- At least one drafter knowledgeable of accessibility
- Closely aligned with internal company policy
- Should at least be mentioned within your internal company policy (referenced document? – depends)
- Requirements
- Preferences
- Procurement process



# Policy Creation con't

- Definitions
- Roles responsible
- Any scoring system / evaluation criteria
  - Details
- Dates
- Reporting
- Enforcement



# Requirements

- What will you require?
  - Training
  - Agreement to standards (e.g., your own guidelines)
  - WCAG 2.0 AA
  - ACR / VPAT
  - Procurement form (yours)
- Tangible evidence of a contractor's ability to meet requirements / standards



# Requirements con't

- Make requirements a part of the contractual agreement.
  - Vendor must meet your baseline requirements at all times
  - Vendor must agree to their assurances provided
  - Duration
- Requirements can always be supplemented with additional details specific to relationship



#### **Preferences**

- Provide for flexibility in policy (e.g., No WCAG 2.2 AA or bust)
- Not because accessibility shouldn't be there but because sometimes it isn't
- If no vendor offers accessible products, then what?
- Industry research is necessary (i.e., it depends what you source)



#### **Procurement Process**

- Put a systematic process in place for evaluating / selecting vendors / procuring products and services
  - Project created
  - Third-party needs identified
  - Base minimum requirements must be met
  - If no minimum requirements met, then second tier process
  - Once minimum pool is left, evaluation process begins



# Evaluation (after minimum requirements)

- VPAT yes
- VPAT issuance self or sourced?
- VPAT named issues raw score, relevance?
- Options for evaluation or remediation

#### Relevance

- Integration sources cards to all news stories (w/ images) into the sidebar of your crypto trading platform but alt text values are not provided
- You only want text headlines and will disable all images from showing
- Technical issue, yes relevant, no



# Weighing Metrics

- Scoring System Possibility
- You do not have to choose a vendor because their product or service has the best accessibility but accessibility must influence your choice.
- If your budget is \$20,000 and a 10/10 accessibility product costs \$500,000, it doesn't matter that that product is the best accessibility choice
- Be realistic but do strongly factor accessibility



# Remediation / Mitigation

- Relevance to use (i.e., is issue related to your use of product?)
- User testing / audits (e.g., does testing group with disability affected find issue detrimental)
- Willingness of vendor to remediate (i.e., is vendor willing to fix issues on the spot to earn contract?



#### Maintenance

- Version 4.2 of product coming out next
- Does accessibility carry over when the new V 4.2 is released?
- Maintained accessibility must be in contract and SOW
- Do not quietly redline it, emphasize accessibility and gauge receptiveness



#### **Intuition Now Saves Later**

- If you know the vendor is only saying what you want to hear, re-evaluate
- Accessibility is essential to your operations
- Procurement education and awareness is a big part of integrating accessibility vs. reacting to problems
- Technically checking boxes leads to problems later
- Reviews vs. automated scan vs. relationship



# Vendor Accessibility Policy

- There's no one way to create one.
- What's important is that your policy is representative and reflective of the realities that present themselves in your current procurement practice
- Create and implement an accessibility policy draft first
- Edit and revise your policy as you run your pilot program (e.g., 6 months to one year)



#### Distribution

- Once you're ready, distribute your Accessibility Policy to all relevant parties
  - Everyone on your procurement team
  - All regular contractors and vendors
- A draft rollout is likely fine (but discuss internally)



#### **Broad Overview**

- Carry forward internal accessibility policy to all vendors
- Put requirements and processes in place to ensure you get an acceptable product / service back in return
- Make contracts contingent upon maintained accessibility / improvement



## Draft First, Refine As You Go

- Maximum 5 pages
- Keep requirements basic and fundamental
- Improve on them as you go
- Getting started with a policy draft now is the perfect first step
